TheData Entry Unit has helped to bring an immense change in the perception, especially of their families, neighbourhood and the communities. These children have had a turnaround in how they are looked upon by their peers and in their behaviours.

Some new jobs have also helped to keep the youth busy and the bubble sheets keep them happy!

In the last few years building capacities of the educators have been given priority. The Training of Teachers (TOT) has been a regular feature throughout the year. Educators share their learnings if they have attended seminars/ workshops elsewhere. New articles, laws and other developments in the field also are discussed from time to time. The monthly meetings help us to discuss challenges and rejoice in successes.

The project with UNICEF brought us face to face with realities giving us the chance to understand the need of malnutrition children and their families vis a vis developmental disabilities; to think of strategies to work at grassroot level; to extend early intervention services to children with malnutrition so that it does not translate into disability.

Enable India, Bengaluru, have shown interest in working with Deepshikha, for persons with intellectual disabilities. We hope to and look forward to see its outcome in the coming months.

"THE GATHERED LEAVES" staged by the Ruchika Theatre Group was an experience not to be forgotten in a long time. महिलाओं द्वारा संचालित एक संस्था

46 वर्ष पूर्व 1973 में समाज की कुछ बुद्धिजीवी महिलाओं ने एक अत्यन्त ही चुनौतीपूर्ण कार्य करने का संकल्प लिया जिसके फलस्वरूप पुरश्री की स्थापना हुई। यह संस्था विगत चार दशकों से महिलाओं के सामाजिक एवं सांस्कृतिक विकास के क्षेत्र में अनवरत कार्यरत है। उन्होंने अपने प्रयास, सकारात्मक दृष्टिकोण, गहन विचारधारा एवं महत्वपूर्ण योगदान के बल पर 17 जुलाई 1988 में दीपशिखा की स्थापना की। यह एक अत्यंत ही चुनौतिपूर्ण कदम था किन्तु आज संस्था ने समाज में एक मिसाल कायम कर रखी है। दीपशिखा एवं बाल विकास एवं मानसिक स्वास्थ्य संस्थान है जो समाज को पुरश्री की देन है। सात महिलाओं से शुरु हुई इस संस्था में आज 290 सदस्य हैं जो इसकी लोकप्रियता को दर्शाता है।

2018-19 के कार्यकलाप :



- Number of new children registered : 219.
- Number of self-referrals have increased.
- The total percentage of male new cases in this year was 72% (158 out of 219), in comparison to only 20% of female new cases.
- The maximum number of children coming here fall under 6 years of age (130 out of 219).
- 29% of families are below the poverty line.
- 26% of the families come from the rural area.



Majority of children coming to Deepshikha outdoor clinic have diagnosis of mental retardation, followed by Developmental Delay. The trend noticed here is decline in cerebral palsy cases and a steep rise in children with autism. Deepshikha caters to children with speech and learning difficulties too.

Success Story

Satyam is a 5 year old full term child with a birth weight of 3.5 kgs. He had passed meconium and was aspirated because of which the child experienced a delayed birth cry. However, when he cried his cry was inconsolable. The hospital discharge report suggested perinatal asphyxia with excessive cry and recurrent seizure and apnea. He was also kept in ventilator.

When Satyam came to Deepshikha with delayed milestones, regular intervention was absolutely necessary for his holistic development. But his parents did not come for two years which greatly hampered the progress. His physical activities got compromised and led to severe behavioral disorders. After intensive therapies he has progressed mentally and physically.

Early Intervention

Total No of Cases: 92

Total No. of Sessions: 322

This program is the core program of Deepshikha which has successfully catered to more than 5000 children. The content of the program is designed in a way which brings about holistic change in the individual regardless of the diagnosis.

- Services in this program include physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, behavior modification and self-help skills done simultaneously four days a week. This is a group therapy program with a mixed group with children at different functional levels but more or less the same age level.
- Based on this pattern and the research done on teaching-learning material required we have developed an early-intervention kit also which is provided to every parent so that follow up is better at home.
- The success of the program is spelt out when we were assigned to train Rashtriya Baal Suraksha Karyakram (RBSK)
 doctors on our model of early intervention. Our team also visited 5 Malnutrition treatment centers repeatedly
 and trained the mothers to handle malnourished children so that the component of disability could be eliminated.

Success Story



Ambar Pankaj Bara is a 7 year old full term, normal delivery child who was born at home. The child experienced a delayed birth cry. After two days, the child suffered from jaundice and was in the incubator for 15 days. Again, after a year the child struggled from epileptic seizures. When he came to Deepshikha, he had the following problems:

- 1. Unable to sit and stand
- Unable to hold neck
- 3. Unable to speak
- 4. Severe Athetosis

After regular intervention, the child has improved considerably. The child can now hold his neck at will, has started speaking certain sounds, and his sitting and standing has improved significantly.

ComDEALL

Highlights

The (FMIP) Family Mediated Intervention Programme started on 4th July,2017 get tremendous positive response. Parents found if very productive and result oriented. Significant improvement were clearly visible in most of the children within 4-6 months of training.

30 out of 44 children taking FMIP training have started going to regular schools and doing well there.

Two of the children came after a gap of 1 year for follow up services. They were provided with effective intervention plan and within three months they showed improvement.

Deepshikha organized "One day training workshop for management of sensory issues in children with special needs" on 28th September 2018 (Friday) at our Namkum Centre. The Workshop was conducted by Ms Shilpa Sankhla, Senior Occupational Therapist from ComDEALL Bangalore. More than 25 person including special teachers of various NGOs, professionals & parents attended & benefited from this training.

On 29th September 2018, Ms Shilpa Sankhla also conducted a training cum question answer session with parents of Deepshikha comDEALL Unit. More than 15 parents attended the session. Some of the topics covered in sensory training were Understanding the Sensory System, sensory and behavioral issues, Common sensory issues seen in children with ASW. Sensory integration/intervention sensory diets. The session was very interactive and useful as theory was explained with practical sessions and video inputs.

On 22nd and 23rd March Deepshkha organized another workshop in collaboration with NRTT and ComDEALL Trust, Bangalore on "Communication: Assessment and Intervention methods used at ComDEALL". The training was conducted by Ms. Vineeta Tiwary, certified SLP from ComDEALL, Banglore. Twenty parents attended the workshop. The training covered many useful relevant topics such as building an understanding of gestures, enhancing receptive skills, speech and language stimulation for building expressive language etc.

Pre-School

In charge : Anupa Gupta

No. of Children : 33
No. of Children Integrated : 4

This program is a school-preparation program where apart from academic and group therapy, focus is on socialisation skills manners, toilet training, grooming and general etiquette.

25% of children have been integrated in mainstream schools.

Success Story

Zaina



Zaina is now $4^{1/2}$ years old reported with developmental delay. Her parents searched the Internet to know about Deepshikha. When Zaina was brought here she had following complaints:

- She had separation anxiety from her mother.
- Incessant crying when separated from her mother.
- She couldn't speak more than 8-10 letters.
- She could see the objects but turns her hand inwards during activities.
- She couldn't respond to her name.

It was observed that Zaina likes poems and is attracted to face masks. She was slowly separated from her mother during poems and rhymes after which she was made to do activities. She can now frame small sentences and is going to Sham Rock School.

Aarush Samguria

Aarush Samguria is a 5 year old boy who was diagnosed with Down's syndrome with his left leg completely twisted and was a little short when compared to the right leg.

- His developmental milestones of talking and walking were delayed.
- There was no speech.
- His mouth was always open.
- He could not bend at all.

On the very first day itself, he started pronouncing 'A'. After 7 months of training, he has developed mentally as well as physically. He can now speak all letters except W and can read numbers upto 10. He speaks two-letter words like Papa, Bye-bye, Phu-phu,

phupha, kaka etc. He can write independently and helps others in day to day activities. His posture has also improved and can now walk for some time and can bend his spinal cord and knees. He can now eat independently also.



Individualised Education Program (IEP)

In charge : Urmila Singh, Priyanka Jain

New : 11 Follow-ups : 32 Total Sessions : 240

The importance of this program lies in the fact that every individual has his own way of growing up, his personal likes and dislikes in relation to environment, touch, sound, food, dress etc. To work with parents individually and frame a program which will be result-oriented is the outcome of the teacher's patience and dedication.

Success Story



Aarna is a 3.5 year old full term child who was born through a cesarean delivery. When Aarna was brought here she was very hyperactive and did not have sitting tolerance. She was unable to maintain eye-to-eye contact and had poor sleep habits. She also indulged herself in self-stimulating behavior like finger play.

Her parents consulted at Bangalore to find that their child is 'at risk' for Autism Spectrum Disorder. Here, she was enrolled in the IEP program, 5 days a week for two months. Now she is able to sit for 25-30 minutes. She has started imitating the therapist and sings her favorite rhymes. Her communication skills have also improved and she has now started following

commands. She communicates her needs both verbally and also through gestures.

Shravya Sahu

Shravya is a 5 year old female, premature child born with congenital anomalies. She had syndromic facies and was operated for cleft palate at the age of one year. At the age of 9 months, she developed fits for which medication was given and it continued for one and a half years. She had poor weight gain and significant delayed milestones. Before coming to Deepshikha, she visited CMC, Vellore where detailed assessment was done and was referred to Deepshikha.

When she came to Deepshikha, she was already diagnosed with Global Developmental Delay. She had a short stature with sleep dysfunctions and autistic traits. Moreover, her performance age was 22.11 months at the time of assessment.

Therapeutic interventions were followed as guided by the CMC, Vellore with emphasis on self-help skills. Her chewing improved and she started eating solid food and also began toilet indication. Considering her difficulties and irregular intervention, Shravya, however, has shown significant improvement. She is now attending Pre-school program in Deepshikha.

Special School

In charge : Anju Prasad

No. of students : 37
New Entrants : 2
Drop outs : 2

Special school at Deepshikha runs with an aim to mainstream the children with mental disabilities by making them independent in ADL along with other curricular and co-curricular activities.

Highlights

- Teachers Student ratio of 1:5 in the primary and 1:9 in the secondary class helps to give individual attention to each and every student as per their need.
