



- Number of new children registered: 198
- ❖ The total percentage of male new cases in this year was 74.24% (147 out of 198), whereas only 20% female new cases were reported.
- 29% of families are from below the poverty line
- ❖ 26% of the families come from the rural area.
- ❖ The maximum number of children registered are in the age range of 0-6 years. (134 out of 198).
- Deepshikha being the only institute of its kind in Jharkhand, continues to serve infants and toddlers with special needs to bring qualitative and quantitative improvement. The farfetched results of this are

- strong positivity in the family,
- > Child's improvement is so satisfactory that often it is difficult to make out the disability
- > They are now directly approaching Deepshikha.

SUCCESS STORY

- **SHOURYA** Is a child with low birth weight was born prematurely with Sevre muscle spasm and primitive reflexes prevailing.
 - > He had no visual responses
 - > He had prominent Startle reflex.
 - > Sevre spinal scoliosis. He would round up when made to lie down

After regular therapy in E.I programme he is able to lie down straight in supine posture. The child now responds to visual stimulation, maintain sitting balance with support.

EARLY INTERVENTION

Early Intervention Programme has catered to more than 5000 children. It aims at bringing holistic development in the child.

- Services In this programme include Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Behaviour Modification and Self-help Skills which are done four days a week.
- An Early Intervention Kit, developed at Deepshikha is provided to every parent so that follow up is better at home.

SUCCESS STORY

ANANYA visited Deepshikha when she was 9 months old. The child Experienced delayed birth cry. Ananya had the following problems:

- Poor neck holding
- Unable to sit
- Unable to hold object

After 3 months of regular intervention Ananya can now hold her neck. She can also sit and stand with support.



HIGHLIGHTS

The (FMIP) Family Mediated Intervention Programme started on 4th July, 2017 and since then has received tremendous response. ComDEALL is goal oriented and has a good success rate. Within 4-6 months of training, significant improvement is visible in most of the children.

SUCCESS STORY



SANKALP was four years old, when he came to Deepshikha with complaints like inability to speak, socialization, inattention and inability to write.

We did various assessments, and planned his intervention. Focus was on improvement in sustained attention, eye contact, eye gaze, sitting tolerance and compliance. Improvement was seen and by the end of four months his PLS became age appropriate.

During this procedure, his stammering also has reduced. Now he attends a mainstream school with follow ups at Deepshikha.

PRE-SCHOOL:

Pre-school focuses on socialisation, manners, toilet training, grooming, and general etiquette. It prepares the child to adjust with other children.

SUCCESS STORY



MANVEER AND PAWAN are twins who are now 6 years old. They come from rural area. They were brought to **Deepshikha in 2019 with the following complaints:**

- Delayed milestone
- Attention Deficit
- Hyperactive
- Delayed speech

After speech therapy and special education considerable improvement was seen in them. The children are now able to make eye contact and respond to parents. They have progressed to self-pretend play, can communicate with limited speech and have achieved the desired goals.

INDIVIDUALISED EDUCATION PROGRAM (IEP)

Every individual has his own way of growing up, his personal likes and dislikes in relation to environment, touch, sound, food, dress etc. The objective of the programme is to work with parents individually and frame a program, suitable for the child to bring out desired result.

SUCCESS STORY

PRATYAKSH RAJ is now 5 years old coming from a the middle class semi-urban family. The child came to **Deepshikha in 2019 with the following complaints:**

- Delayed speech
- Poor communication

The child was born out of normal delivery weighing 4 kgs at the time of the birth. There were no complications before or after birth. After consultation and regular intervention, slow but remarkable improvement was observed. Now, the child shows interest in activities and interacts with others. Problem behaviours like mood swings, tolerance, aggression, irritability levels have reduced. The child now follows instructions; understands facial expression and his level of attention and concentration had increased during sessions.

SPECIAL SCHOOL

In-Charge: GOPIKA ANAND

No. of Students: 39 New Entrants: 6 Drop outs: 2

Special school at Deepshikha runs with an aim to mainstream children with intellectual disabilities by making them independent in ADL along with other curricular and co-curricular activities.

HIGHLIGHTS and Features

- Classroom curriculum is designed based on individualized goals. Theme based teaching technique and play mechanism is adopted.
- 1: 8 Teacher Student's ratio helps to give individual attention to each and every student as per the need.
- Special school also aims to build the overall personality of students in all areas including, sports, dance/drama, art & craft. Children are grouped to perform the activities regularly on a rotation basis.
- Competition for art and craft, dance and sports are organized at regular intervals to assess their skills.
- Students get the opportunity to hone their skills while creating leisure and fun time.
- Based on the academic assessment, students are placed in academic group.
- These students are further trained to prepare for Open Basic Education (NIOS). Government school course curriculum is followed.
- Further based on their academic level, class 1, 2 and 3 syllabus is followed.
- Apart from theory classes and other class activities, practicals are conducted through smart class.
- Interactive learning process and conceptual skill development with pictorial presentations at Smart class is enhancing the personality of our children.
- The Shop "Utkarsh" is used as a lab to train the children and provides better understanding of product's size, shape, price, counting, and billing.
- This shop is also used as a model shop to give the handholding training for children to work in a shop as one of their future goals of being a shop assistant.
- Speech therapy is done at regularly in the presence of the parents so that it can be done at home also.
- Physiotherapy is also done based on the needs and as per the requirements of the children. Parents are trained respectively.
- Regular follow up of the therapies are done to assess the improvement in the child.
- A Special Olympic trained sports teachers has been appointed for giving specific sports training to the children based on their skills.
- Assessment of the children for different sports like cricket, football, bocce ball is in process.

- Apart from sports training, fitness and exercise classes are done every day.
- Training on AAC, on AWAZ APP is being done regularly.
- We are proud to share the participation of our children in unified sports with regular school students for the programme "Meet Your Special Buddy" organized on the occasion of World Disability Day(24th Nov 10th Dec, 2019). Their performance was outstanding.

SUCCESS STORY

- Nilesh Balmuchu our rockstar, helps not only his class mates in the daily activities but also ensures to maintain the hygiene of the school by dusting and cleaning the entire lobby at free hours.
- Rakhi has improved in her verbal skills and is now able to communicate herself more clearly and has become more interactive.

UNIFIED SPORTS

The term inclusion captures, in one word, all-embracing societal ideology. For individuals with disabilities inclusion

secures opportunities to learn alongside their non-disabled peers in general school environment.

This year the idea was to create sensitization that can bring together able and disabled students on a common

platform. A unified sport was found to be the best option. Based on this the idea of Meet Your Special Buddy

came up. Deepshikha, proposed to organize Unified Sports in joint collaboration with Special Olympics

Bharat, and different schools of Ranchi on the occasion of World Disability Week.

Special Olympic is dedicated to promoting social inclusion through shared sports training and competition

experiences. Unified Sports is an attempt to join people with and without intellectual disabilities on the same

team. It was inspired by a simple principle: training together and playing together is a quick path to

friendship and understanding.

In Unified Sports, teams are made up of people of similar age and ability. That makes practices more fun and

games more challenging and exciting for all. Young people with disabilities often do not get a chance to play

even on their own school sports teams.

On Day 1, the event kick started with Bocce ball at DPS, Greater Ranchi. At the day of the event the Principal

of DPS along with the teachers, staff and children were present. The event was very well organized. The

children were playing Bocce ball for the first time. Field was prepared and rules of the game were explained

prior to the event. At the end medals and certificated were presented to both the teams.
