



Services



In the current year 196 new cases have been registered. Maximum no. of children have been registered under 0 – 6years. 75 were registered under Mental Retardation followed by 48 cases under Developmental delay and 21 cases under Autism. Highest number of services, 1253 was provided under Special education followed by 556 services in Early Intervention.

One case with Hunter's Syndrome was also registered.

- Parents are also informed about the various Government schemes and policies. Children are getting benefit from the information available at the centre.
- Parents from different districts are informed and guided on the services and MTCs available in their districts.
- Saket Kumar was referred to MTC Gaya for treatment.

Highlights

- Information board displaying Government norms and policies for PWDs have been proved to useful in guiding parents for making disability certificate, Niramaya Health Insurance, Scholarships.
- Bhawana Bharti got a C.P. chair from Shri Ajit Aggrawal and family.
- 3 children from the OPD have been mainstreamed.
- There has been an increase in the number and frequency of follow up services.
- Parents are now making the effort to avail services for their children.
- As an outcome of the ANM workshop conducted by Deepshikha in collaboration with UNICEF, ANMs have started referring children from different MTCs.

Success Story

Adil Ansari, a four years male child was referred from Garhwa Sadar MTC Kendra SAM NO – 0873, for Early Intervention services in Deepshikha on 21st February, 2018. The child is from a Below Poverty Level (BPL) family. He was reported to have severe malnutrition with a very low body weight. After Treatment his weight at present is 6.320 kg which is still far below the normal percentile. He was identified to have delayed physical and developmental activities.

Therapeutic intervention has been initiated with focus on feeding, positioning and gross motor. Therapy



in other areas like fine motor, cognition, language, socio emotional function is also going on. The child is showing improvement. Follow up once a month has been suggested.

Success Stories

- Harsh Rajgaria, 4 years old came with complaints of poor speech and behaviour. Family, in spite of being under severe economic crisis, continued his services and within just 2-3 months Harsh showed improvement in his behaviour and significant improvement in speech.
- Shiv Kumar Thakur came for assessment and therapy at an age of 4 months, with a mental age of 0-2 months. His parents were trained and when they came back for follow up, the child showed visible improvement.

Early Intervention

In charge: Pushplata Singh Number of beneficiaries: 50

Total number of services provided: 449

Highlights

- Unique in its component and execution.
- Parents and special educators work together to set the goals for the child. This is followed by intervention to give better result.
- Developed Early Intervention kit for sale. Parents find it extremely useful in training and intervention of the children.

Success Stories

- Kanaklata was under weight and had difficulty in eating due to tight jaw muscles and cleft palate. With regular oromotor and jaw exercises and therapies to enhance proper swallowing there has been significant improvement in her body weight. Thereafter her cleft palate surgery could be performed.
- After frequent counselling and therapy, Reyan's attendance is now regular and has showed improvement in neck holding and can now sit with support.
- Rishu has Down syndrome and used to sit with support when he came. After 5 months of regular training, he is now able to crawl and stand with support. He has improved socialization and has started developing speech.

ComDEALL

In Charge: Deepa Jalan Number of beneficiaries: 24

IEP: 3 **FMIP:** 21 **Number of services:** 296

New admissions: 2

- Completed 3 years.
- Family Mediated Intervention Programme (FMIP) started in July 2017.



FMIP was started considering that most cases were from outside Ranchi. Families were having difficulties in relocating. Hence, there were quite a few dropouts.

- 3 children are enrolled under IEP and 21 children are enrolled under FMIP intervention programme.
- Parents are sincerely participating in the activities as guided.
- Significant improvements in all eight areas are seen in the children enrolled under FMIP programme.
- Due to Intensive Speech therapy children are showing improvements in oromotor and communication skills.
- We are happy to share that 4 students Piyush Raj, Shreyas Mahto, Shipra Jha and Nishi Prasad have been mainstreamed to regular school.

After an intensive training by Mrs. Indu Dev from ComDEALL, Bangalore, the number of parents coming for the Family Mediated Intervention Programme has increased tremendously. Families are required to come at 15 days interval for a follow up on the goals and to set new ones. Now the services are given twice in a week.

The child taking IEP services are served on one to one basis. Each child gets at least 2 therapies of 45 minutes duration by therapists comprising of an occupational therapist, a Special Educator, a Speech therapist and a Psychologists, three days a week.

FMIP Programme has turned out to be a successful intervention plan. 60% children are better adjusted and doing well in mainstream school. Parents are satisfied and happy with the positive changes their children have shown. In FMIP, (as a follow up service) after one year, the child is called once in a month or two months to address any remaining problem/issue.

Out of ten children, two of them are enrolled in regular school and two have been shifted to FMIP programme.

Success Stories

- Siddharth initially faced problems communicating, socializing and had poor eye hand coordination. After
 intervention, he now mingles with others and has shown improvement in communication and eye-hand
 coordination.
- Piyush Raj, Shreyas Mahto, Shipra Jha and Nishi Prasad mainstreamed to regular school.

Pre School

In charge: Anupa Gupta Number of beneficiaries: 23 Number of services provided: 783

- Focus is on developing pre-writing and pre-reading skills along with social and communication skills, special education, physiotherapy and occupational therapy.
- 10 minutes Speech therapy is included in the class curriculum.
- The focus is on mainstreaming in regular schools.
- 8 children have been mainstreamed this year.



Success Stories

- Anushka is integrated in regular school, Zee Libra. She initially had difficulty in recognizing letters, but now she understands and can write complete set of letters.
- Pratik has Autism, had lots of attention and concentration problems. He was not independent in basic skills like toileting and speech. With regular training, he is now becoming independent in daily activities and has gradually shown improvement in speech.

Individualized Education Programme

In charge: Urmila Singh Number of beneficiaries: 15

Number of services provided: 388

Highlights

- Individualized attention is given to children.
- Children going to mainstream school benefit from this service.
- Children come here regularly for remedial teaching.
- One to one teaching is provided to children with significant problems in learning.
- Areas like concentration, group behaviour and cognitive skills are worked upon.
- Vibration therapy is used to reduce sensory issues in children.
- Intervention and work is also done to solve behaviour issues.

Achievers

- Shreya's attention duration improved significantly when video was used as a tool. She now enjoys the vibrant colors, lights and pictures on the videos.
- Aditya Singh was able to do activities only when prompted physically. But now he is able to write letters from A to P when prompted verbally.
- Abu Rehan has been mainstreamed to Ekra, Government school.

Special School

In charge: Alpana No. of students: 33 New Admission: 10

Drop out: 6

- Teaching approach was modified and Smart Class concept was introduced.
- Emphasis was on activity and theme based learning. This brought a significant and positive change in students.
- Students participated in cultural and inclusive activities like fashion show, dance and yoga competition.
- Students did a number of theme based recreational activities along with DEd. Special Education students.



- We are happy to share that Aditya Chowdhary mainstreamed to a regular school.
- Anju Prasad being groomed to be the new In charge.

Success Stories

- Ankit Kumar is a very shy boy by nature and has problem mixing up with others. But now, He is a Leader!
 He conducts assembly and ensures that everyone does their morning exercises properly.
- Riya Kumari and Nilesh Balmuchu, shy by nature and used to be a follower, now have become leaders and conduct assembly when their turn comes.

- Children are now using appliances like sandwich maker and making a variety of dishes.
- Aniket Shanu underwent a complicated surgery with financial support from Purshree.
- Children do creative activities like making key rings, TLM Bags and folders which are put up for exhibitions.
- They rocked the stage by walking the ramp in a fashion show organized by Tourism Department,
 Jharkhand.

CRE (Continuing Rehabilitation Education) Programme of RCI

This year Deepshikha conducted 3 CRE programmes. All the programmes were conducted to train the professionals in this field who would further do counselling, support and intervention of the children, and to help in their mainstreaming in school, at work, in relationships, and in the community.

The need for such programmes cannot be underestimated.

1st CRE – 30th & 31st August, 2017

Two days Continuing Rehabilitation Education programme was conducted on "Practical Strategies to develop positive behaviours, communication and relevant skills in individual with exceptionalities".

The programme was conducted as a joint collaboration of NIEPMD & Reeta Peshawaria Centre (RPC) for Autism and ABA services. 30 In service Professionals from Bihar, West Bengal and Jharkhand and parents from Ranchi attended the programme.

Mrs. Simmi Santha, Consultant Behaviour Analyst and Dr. Mereen Punnen, Clinical Director, RPC, conducted the sessions.

2nd CRE – 22nd to 26th December, 2017

Five days CRE programme was conducted on "Training to be a teacher who can design and enable an Inclusive and Higher Education".

30 In service Professionals from Bihar and Jharkhand attended the programme.

The five days sessions were conducted by Dr. Alok Bhuwan, founder Manovikas, New Delhi and highly qualified resource teachers from Ranchi.

Three days CRE programme was conducted on "Promotion of School Mental Health Pogramme". 30 In service Professionals from Bihar and Jharkhand attended the programme.


